Culture: Trailing Rosemary 'Rosmarinus officinalis Prostratus' is a hardy, fast growing evergreen shrub, creeping rosemary has a prostrate habit and attractive flowers and fragrance. Dark green leaves, 2 inches long, are rich in aromatic oils and commonly used as a culinary herb. This plant is love for its strong flavor and fragrance.

Growth Habit: Should be kept moist in well-drained soil and full sun with free-draining soil or compost. This plant is ideal for a rock garden or use as a ground cover.
