Aquilegia chrysantha hinckleyana 'Texas Gold'


Partial/full shade

**Growth Habit:** Columbine has an open, clumping habit and spreads to 2'. The plant's clover-like foliage will burn and the plant will go dormant in full summer sun. When well watered and shaded, it may stay evergreen.

**Bloom:** This cool season bloomer sports bright yellow, slightly fragrant flowers atop long stems March-May. The flowers have attractive long spurs.

**Notes:** Native columbines and their hybrids are best for Texas. They hybridize freely when different species are grown together. Columbines are not long-lived, but they reseed.
