

## **Coral Bells**

Heuchera sanguinea



#### Partial shade/shade

 $1'-2' \times 1'$ 

### Evergreen foliage

#### Pink, red blossoms, spring - early summer

# Attracts hummingbirds

**Culture:** Grow coral bells in partial shade to full shade. Morning sun is okay. Coral bells will thrive in most types of moist, well-drained soil except heavy clay. This plant has a medium heat tolerance. Plant nursery rooted plant in the fall or early spring. Propagate them by division in late fall or early spring.

**Growth Habit:** This evergreen perennial produces clumps of low spreading foliage to 1" wide. Its rounded leaves have attractive scalloped edges similar to strawberries. Leaf color depends on variety.

**Bloom:** Spikes (panicles) of small pink or red bell-shaped flowers are produced on stems '- 2' in late spring – early summer.

**Notes:** This plant is attractive as a groundcover and great as a border plant in shade gardens and around deciduous shrubs.
