Lantana montevidensis

Full Sun

1 foot tall, 4 feet wide

Salt tolerant & deer resistant

Culture: Lantana montevidensis are considered native or naturalized to Texas. Lantanas grow best in dry, sunny sites. They tolerate salt, poor soils and reflected heat. Lantanas generally prefer neutral to alkaline, well-drained soil. They are drought tolerant, but flower best when watered.

Growth Habit: This plant's woody stems have leaves that are rough-textured and grey-green. Trailing Lantana grows about 1 foot tall and spreads to 4 feet wide. Some types form berries after flowering remove them to promote bloom.

Bloom: Lantanas have flat clusters of long-blooming flowers. Lantana montevidensis is a lavender color. Other color combinations are also available. Blooms continue from early summer until frost.

Notes: Cut back freeze-damaged wood in early spring
