Lantana montevidensis




1 foot tall, 4 feet wide

Lavender colored blooms/Attracts butterflies

Salt tolerant & deer risistant

Summer - Frost

Texas SuperstarTM



Growth Habit: This plant's woody stems have leaves that are roughtextured and grey-green. Trailing Lantana grows about 1 foot tall and spreads to 4 feet wide. Some types form berries after flowering remove them to promote bloom.

Bloom: Lantanas have flat clusters of long-blooming flowers. Lantana montevidensis is a lavender color. Other color combinations are also available. Blooms continue from early summer until frost.

Notes: Cut back freeze-damaged wood in early spring
